Connect:




Working together to receive the right referrals, for the right children and young people at the right time.

Protect:




Making high quality and timely decisions on referrals, using the right information that's relevant, clear & secure.

- We will train SCRA staff in rights.
- We will work with SCRA staff and partners to look at what else we need to do to become a better rights respecting organisation.
- We will work with partners to ensure that children and families have information in Children's Heari ngs to help them understand their rights.
- We will be led by children and those who have lived care experience when we think about new approaches.
